### RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Exhibitor rules #1-40 where applicable.
2. Exhibits of grain and seed should be in clean polyethylene bags. Bags will be supplied and remain the property of the Fair Board.
3. Exhibitors may only make one entry per section. Only one exhibit per farm.
4. All seed grain must have been grown by the exhibitor in 2010 & 2011 except where specified and all underweight samples will be disqualified. Judge's decision to be final.
5. Exhibits will be accepted on Thursday, September 15<sup>th</sup> from 9:00 am to 11:00 am.
6. Entries in grain open to counties of Frontenac, Leeds & Grenville, Lennox & Addington.
7. Exhibits to remain until Sunday, September 18<sup>th</sup> after 4:00 pm.
8. Fifteen (15%) percent of prize money deducted for entry fees.

Hay exhibits to consist of two 4” flakes out of a bale, each in polyethylene bag, tied together and each lot tagged, one to be used for judging and discarded, the other for show. Polyethylene bags for hay and silage available from the agricultural society at no charge. Only one entry per farm in each section.

1. Bale of Hay (not broken) first cut mixed legume and grass 70% and 30% either way
2. First cut Alfalfa, 85% or more alfalfa
3. First cut Other Legume, 85% or more legumes
4. First cut Mixed Legume and Grass, 70% and 30% either way
5. First cut Grass Hay, 85% or more grass

6. Second cut Alfalfa or Other Legume, 85% or more legume
7. Second cut Mixed Legumes and Grass, 70% and 30% either way
8. Haylage - 4.5 kg (in polyethylene bags)
9. First cut Baled Haylage - 4.5 kg
10. Second or third cut Baled Haylage, identified – 4.5 kg
11. Oat and/or Barley Silage – 4.5 kg
12. Corn Silage – 4.5 kg
13. Baylage (unchopped) - 4.5 kg
