RULES & REGULATIONS

Any person entering articles for judging within the Homecraft and Handicraft Section **MUST** be a member in good standing of the Kingston and District Agricultural Society.

1. Exhibitor rules # 1 – 40 where applicable.
2. The closing date for entries will be 11:15 a.m. Thursday September 15th, 2011
3. Entries to be judged are to be brought to the Homecraft Area Wednesday, September 14th, 2011 between the hours of 6:00 p.m. – 8:00 p.m. or Thursday, September 15th between the hours of 9:00 a.m. – 11:15 a.m.
4. **All items are to be the work of the exhibitor. Items may be shown For no more than 2 consecutive years.**
5. Judging will begin at 12:00 p.m. (noon) Thursday, September 15th, 2011.
6. Only prize-winning entries will be displayed. Other items may be picked up following the Judging (approximately 4:00 – 5:00 p.m. Thursday). Any items not picked up will become the property of the Agricultural Society unless appropriate arrangements are made between the Exhibitor and the Office.
7. Tags are to be completed by the exhibitor showing the correct class and number as listed in the Fair Prize Book and attached SECURELY to the work. Otherwise the work will be disqualified.
8. Please DO NOT bring coat hangers.
9. Seniors 65 years and older (men or women) living in a retirement home may enter any class for a membership fee of \$1.00.
10. All Judges selected by the Agricultural Society are fully qualified and competent. Their decision is final. Judges are authorized by the Directors to discard all soiled items, or items having a bad odour (i.e. smoke) worn or old exhibits. Prizes are to be awarded to new and updated work only.
11. Exhibits must be removed by Sunday, September 18th 2011 between the hours of 4:00 – 6:00 p.m. from the Homecraft Area.
12. Contestants may enter as many classes as they wish, but may only submit one entry per class.

13. Homcraft Youth Division prize money will be paid in cash and available at the Office Wicket between 12:00p.m. (Noon) and 3:00 p.m. on Saturday, September 17th, 2011
14. **No items are to be framed unless stated.**
15. Fifteen (15%) percent of prize monies deducted for entry fees.

O.A.A.S. HAND QUILTED CHAMPIONSHIP QUILT COMPETITION

Enter your Quilt in the 2011 Kingston Fall Fair and be eligible for the O.A.A.S. Quilt Competition. A Grand Champion will be selected from the available quilts in Section 2–6. The winner will compete at the District Level in October 2011. The District Winner will compete at the Provincial Level in February 2012 at the OAAS Annual Convention held in Toronto. **PLEASE DO NOT DISPLAY QUILTER’S NAME.**

O.A.A.S. Prize Money \$500.00 - Winner keeps their quilt

1. Entries must be solely made and hand quilted by an individual or group and exhibited and judged at a local Agricultural Society Fair to be eligible for this competition.
2. Annual Championship Quilts must be a minimum of 72” by 90”. (Smaller quilts will not be eligible to proceed to the next level of competition)
3. Judging will occur at Local Fairs and District Levels. A Provincial Grand Champion Quilt will be selected at the Annual O.A.A.S. Convention.
4. Upon making an entry into the O.A.A.S. Quilt Competition, the exhibitor agrees to participate in any promotional activities related to the competition.
5. The winning O.A.A.S. Champion Quilt will not be eligible to compete in any further District and/or Convention O.A.A.S. competitions.
6. The Winner’s name and PATTERN will be displayed at the Fair on a sign provided by **O.A.A.S. Samples of fabric and threads must be attached.**

IN MEMORY OF ELEANOR GIBSON

PILLOWCASE FOR CANCER – This project is to be Presented to children in the Cancer Treatment Centre of the Kingston General Hospital. Please use the recommended Fabric.

Pillowcase Construction – Standard Pillowcase 20” x 31”:

Supplies:

- 3/4 yard of cotton or flannel fabric for pillowcase
- 1/3 yard of cotton or flannel fabric for border of pillowcase
- 3” by 41” accent fabric

Sewing Instructions:

- 1) Cut the body of the pillowcase 27” x width of fabric
- 2) Cut pillowcase accent colour 3” x width of fabric.
- 3) Cut pillowcase cuff 9” x width of fabric.
- 4) Open the 9” trim fabric, place on table with **RIGHT** side up. **DO NOT FOLD IN HALF.**
- 5) Fold the 3” strip in half lengthwise with **WRONG SIDES TOGETHER**, Press, pin to top edge of 9” trim
- 6) Open up the body piece and place **RIGHT** side down on top of 9” and 3” strip. Pin in place. **DO NOT SEW.**
- 7) Roll the bottom edge of the body fabric up towards the trim until you can see the bottom edge of the trim piece.
- 8) Take the bottom edge of the trim piece and pull it up to the edges that you have pinned together. Re-Pin this makes a tube with the body of the pillowcase tucked inside.
- 9) Stitch $\frac{3}{4}$ seam along the pinned edge.

- 10) Reach inside the tube and pull out the body of the pillowcase and trim.
- 11) Pin wrong sides of pillowcase together. Even up on edges. Stitch ¼” seam. This is a French seam.
